Until the church reopens, we will be having weekly Zoom Sunday services led by Ruth, Fiona, Graham, Pat and Jill Hunt.

I have spoken to Alison last week and she is saying that it now seems most likely that she will move in the middle of August and be ready to start her ministry with us for the beginning of September.
