Dear Friends

We are now into the second week of Lent, how is your Lenten journey going? Mine started rather shakily as I was laid low by one of the many bugs that is going round, unable to talk for coughing I kept away from people and felt pretty rough. I'm still coughing now but am feeling much better.

Have you managed to keep your resolve to give up chocolate/biscuits whatever? Have you been able to fulfil the extra discipline you choose if you did?

Being ill at least meant that I had time to read and reflect, I have maintained my Lent book discipline and am finding very interesting The Art of Lent by Sister Wendy Beckett.

Lent can be a time for reflection on our lives, on our journey with God and on the world. At the moment the first two for me are relatively straightforward, but reflecting on the world is much harder. I want to ignore all the cruelty and hardship that exists, but I can't, it breaks my heart hearing stories of the daily suffering in Gaza, Ukraine and other places. I don't want to hear politicians and others refusing to answer honest questions or stirring up divisions, but if I don't listen how I can be informed about the issues and make up my mind about where I stand. And in all this where does faith come in and what, if any, part does it play?

It is because of my faith that I must reflect on the world, God's world and that faith inspires action. Action that sometimes seem passive, holding the world with all its hardship and suffering before God in prayer is very important, joining with all the payers of other people of faith for a different reality. Action that seeks to show everyone that God created humanity in God's image to live in harmony, peace respecting all whatever their ethnicity etc.

Lenten reflection leads to Easter hope for me, as the Easter message in the resurrection of Jesus is about love defeating hatred, eternal life after death, the new possibilities for God's world as humanity can be changed to reflect more truly God's image.

I wish you all an happy Easter and finish with those wonderful Easter acclamations, Christ is risen, He is risen indeed Alleluia.

The theme of the Exhibition is:

Life's Journey - HOPE.

The venue will be confirmed as soon as possible and is dependent on the number of potential exhibits. It will be within Romford Town Centre and most likely situated within the Liberty Mall.

Please 'like' the facebook group 'Easter Art for Everyone' Exhibition to stay up to date with developments.

- Deadline for applications is 22nd March 2023
- You will be responsible for transporting your piece to and from the venue.
- Pieces must be delivered in a form ready for exhibition. Photographs must be mounted.
- Final deadline for delivery of piece the exhibit will grow during the week, but if you can get your piece to the venue before Monday 25th March, that would be great!
- Collection can be arranged when you drop your item off.
- If you fail to collect the piece, it will be placed on display at the Salvation Army in Romford and 'auctioned' to raise funds for the Salvation Army. After that, any items remaining will be destroyed.
- The Exhibition will be open to all people of all ages, faiths and none.
- Exhibits will be 'family friendly' respectful of all people and while they might represent difficult thoughts and emotions, will not be offensive the organisers will make the final decision and pieces may be rejected on that basis.
- The exhibits will remain the responsibility of the exhibitors.

 The venue insurance will not cover the exhibits; any exhibitor requiring insurance must arrange their own cover.
- If you wish to exhibit more than one piece, be aware that the number of entries per individual exhibitor may be limited depending on available space.

Selling Pieces:

If you wish for your piece to be available for sale during the exhibition, you will be responsible for the negotiations and sale yourself – the exhibition organiser will not act as brokers. Please email mike.stannett@salvationarmy.org.uk for guidance

Mali World Watch List 2024 - 15



Christians are a tiny minority in Algeria, comprising 144,000 (0.3 per cent) of the country's total population of just over 46

million. The major drivers of persecution in Algeria are society and extremist Islamic teachers who exert influence over state authorities. This means Christian's experience persecution from their families, their communities and from the government.

Most Algerian Christians are converts from Islam. They face harassment and discrimination in their daily lives, and their families and community may try to force them to continue to adhere to Islamic norms and practices. They also face pressure - from both the government and their surrounding communities - to renounce their faith in Jesus and return to Islam. Many choose to keep their faith

Additionally, state pressure has increased on Protestant Christians to a level not seen in decades. Previously closed church buildings are still shut down, and many other churches were ordered to close. The government threatened to prosecute some church leaders if their churches continued to meet. Algeria has laws restricting non-Muslim worship, including rules that prohibit anything that would

'shake the faith of a Muslim' or could be used as a 'means of seduction intending to convert a Muslim to another religion'. These vague laws can be used to pressure Christians to keep their faith quiet and to

beat down anything.

The majority of Christians live in the north of Algeria - an environment that has allowed Christian community to develop, although pressure from both government and society remains strong. But in other parts of the country, especially in the south, circumstances are difficult for Christians, with a very low number of available churches. While violent Islamic militants don't have a wide support base among the general population, radical Muslim teachers exert an increasing influence over Algerian government.

Algeria has risen four places on the World Watch List. There have been increases in pressure in national life and church life – but it was the rise in violence score which had most influence on the overall rise. This was mainly caused by an increased number of churches being closed or forced to cease all activity. At the same time, a greater number of houses and businesses of



Christians were raided, with the increased pressure forcing many to relocate both inside and outside the country.

Please keep praying for your brothers and sisters in Algeria. Your prayers make an enormous difference to those following Jesus no matter the cost.

Open Doors works with local partners and churches in North Africa to provide leadership and discipleship training, livelihood support, legal aid, trauma counselling, Bibles and pastoral care.
